President's Report

Season 24/25 has been a good one for MCCCC. Our boys were awarded the ACT Junior Cricket Club Championship for only the sixth time in ACT junior cricket history. It's a great award to win because it represents the performance of our whole club and reflects on the effort of all our teams. 31 teams, many of which played in both a weekend and a midweek competition, provided opportunities for over 330 players to play 566 games this season. This saw teams play between 14 and 24 games each for the club. The fact we had 12 Stage 1 teams showed a tidal wave of participation at the earliest levels. Sustaining 10 teams in stage 2, 6 in stage 3 and 3 in Colts showed that the club and school has a healthy cricket culture which encourages boys along their cricket journey. Our high club participation shows the satisfaction our players get from playing, being part of a team, having the opportunity to improve, achieving club milestones, representing the school, achieving selection in representative teams, and when older, transitioning into senior cricket. It is an exciting time for cricket in Canberra, and Cricket ACT is ambitious to increase our territory's access into national level competitions like the BBL and Sheffield Shield. If their efforts come to fruition, boys in our club can aspire to even higher levels of cricket in the future.

As a club, the environments we sustain around our teams keep boys coming back to cricket. Our volunteers and families are the heartbeat of these environments. No games happen without our scorers, umpires, managers, coaches, committee members, team and player support. Our families fulfilled these roles with enthusiasm and dedication this season, creating outstanding cricket experiences for our boys. We have a fantastic blend of people in the club: capable, experienced, trained, volunteers and long term contributors working alongside enthusiastic newcomers to the club. We were extremely lucky to have several old boys back in their cricket club in a variety of roles this season, and it is just as special seeing our senior students taking on service as coaches in the pre-season and across the season. Amongst our dedicated volunteers, Racheal McDonald, Narelle Luchetti and Kylie Denny showed the way managing two teams each. This season's club volunteer award went to Mrs Lynn Chua for her amazing work on social media, celebrating our big moments, advertising our events and recognising our cricket achievements with great humour and respect for our teams. This year Lynn experimented with new ways of presenting our cricket stories, including with videos and interviews and Lynn unearthed some media stars of the future in the process.

Our club culture was epitomised by the senior players running coaching sessions for junior boys in the pre-season. Thanks for showing the way Aby Tharmarajah, Lucas Louis, Alex Teodorowych, Sachin Weerasinghe, Aarush Patel, Luke Allardyce, Jarrad Wilson, Viira Peiris, Sam Walsh, Josh Nuss, Will Rees, James Bartlett, Hamish Foley, Tommy Smith, Levi Belcher, Riley Roberts, Noah Polishuk, Callum Fenwick, Sachin Liyanage, Adam Clarke, Ethan Golder, Noah Brown, Keyaan Darji, Edwin Tijo, Logan McRae, Adhavan Sundar, and Vishnu Vaijayanathan; and special mention to our senior boys who coached teams across the whole season, being Nate Hamilton, Xander Denny, Noah Brown, Viira Peiris, Aby Tharmarajah, Will Rees and Jack Southa. I'm certain efforts like these are paving the way for our newcomers to have a great season and a long association with Marist cricket, inspiring them towards the levels of cricket skill that might be reached by the time they are in Colts.

These comments reinforce what a fantastic group we have in the club.

And we inducted two new life members into the club this season. Life membership recognises the highest contribution and exceptional service to the club over an extended period of time. The committee and Head of School were delighted to induct Mr Matt Scholtens and Mrs Penny Scholtens into club life membership for their tireless contributions in a wide variety of roles (mostly concurrently performed) for over a decade with the club. Congratulations Penny and Matt and thanks for your efforts for the club.

We are grateful also to the school administration and grounds and facilities teams, who continue to invest strongly in our cricket facilities. This season the junior school nets were refurbished in time for pre-season training, and big efforts were made with our cricket ovals to keep them functioning at high levels week to week, and to reinforce them for long term use.

There were some amazing highlights for the season. The pre-season trials we hosted were a fantastic way to start the season. Our families made this a very memorable weekend. Well done to our CACT major award winners Nathan Kerr – ACT Male Cricketer of the Year (U14-U18), Efrem Tijo Male Cricketer of the Year (U10-U13) and Xander Denny – Spirit of Cricket Award winner. They are fantastic achievements. From our Stage 1 ungraded boys getting their first run, boundary, wicket or win, through to seven players scoring their first century for the club, there were highlights in every single match. Our 16 finalists, who won 8 premierships and had a carnival victory should be very proud of their seasons and so should all of our teams who played this season. As we know, no batsman ever scored a run without a partner at the crease, and no bowler ever took a wicket without a field being set. We all share in our team’s successes.

With so much talent coming through, the club’s challenge will always be to structure teams and competitions so boys compete at the right level to continue to develop and improve. I’m certain our selection processes next season will be focussed to achieve this. We wish our boys good luck in the off season. Keeping fit and doing some cricket practice will help hit the ground running at the start of season 25/26.
