### *President's Report*

In Season 2023/24 Marist Cricket Club fielded 43 teams in 21 competitions. The season finished on the weekend of 9/10 March when the last of the 11 Grand Finals we contested played out. 338 boys - 90 of whom were new joiners to cricket - played around 600 games over the season. This was made possible by a huge and committed effort from our club and school community, who scored, coached, managed, umpired, orchestrated and recorded the season - and by our school grounds keepers who again made Oval 1 playable and kept Lindwall Oval in prime condition. All this effort enabled the fun, mateship, competition and development our boys experienced this season.

It was a season of many fantastically close contests. Examples of this included Stage 2 Marist Light versus Wests, where Angus and Samrath held out to tie the match; and so too Colts Div 2 Marist Light against ANU where Adam Clarke's 6 wicket haul secured a thrilling final ball tie. Our teams secured six competition wins this season, with 16 teams playing finals. Our first XI fell agonisingly short of winning the inter-Marist tournament. Many of our boys achieved club milestones, including Sam Smith who pushed the club run-scoring record to 3793 runs. One of our four centurions, First XI allrounder, Lucas Louis, was selected in the Senior ACT Emerging Comets rep team, alongside two past MCCCC players. Alex Gunn joined Sam, Lucas, Nathan Kerr, Luc Tipping, Luca Ciocca Marchant and Dominic Shoebridge in rep teams various this season.

Beyond scorecards, ladders, statistics, milestones and honours, the real highlights of the season occurred at the team level, and was the teamwork and enjoyment experienced by the boys. Our Willow Talk articles attest to this. As Don Bradman wrote: "Play the game wholeheartedly, with spirit and zest, and play to win, but...always treat your opponents as you would have them treat you". Our teams regularly drew comment from their opponents for the excellent spirit in which they played cricket. Our club community's generous donation of cricket gear, balls and bats was gratefully received by the cricket community of flood recovering Lismore, was another example of our sporting spirit, made possible through our school connections.

Our club's generous spirit was also exemplified by the many boys who filled in for other club teams in need, the many senior boys who coached junior boys in the pre-season, and in particular: Solomon Belcher, George Denny, Cian Hickey, Sachin Weerasinghe, Angus Boyd and Jack Smedley who coached teams in our junior grades for the entire season. All of our committed team leaders made wonderful impacts this season. Many completed CACT Level 1 community coaching courses, took advantage of pre-season practical sessions with Jake Floros and also took the opportunity to have Janith Samaratunga, Coach development officer from CACT and our own coaching director, Gary Goodman, alongside at their training sessions to give personalised support. Our vibrant social media reports gave the flavour of our season. Thanks are due to Lynn Chua, Wayne Cassidy and others. The refresh of the Jubilee and Senior school nets paid dividends for our training. Thanks to Al Reid and Penny Brown for leading this initiative. Losing our syntho oval this season was a worthwhile sacrifice but it will be great to have our home ground back next season.

We would like to say a huge thank you to Archie Jenkins, Darcy Coyle, Ernest Morrison and Cam Triglone for filling in regularly for Midnight over this season. Your contributions were nothing short of amazing and we all very much appreciate you donating your time to help us out.

### **THE PLAYERS**

<b>Patrick Coffey</b>	Pat proved to be the Rahul Dravid (for anyone under 40: “the wall” of India, btw 1996-2012) for the Midnights. He proved near impossible to dislodge and got to retire 9-times in his 12 innings. Pat started with a solid pull shot, but through the season he developed his play off the front foot, often charging down the ground to pick off slower balls. He also shone with the ball, claiming best bowling figures of 3/6.

<b>MJ Malan</b>	MJ had a solid if often interrupted season with the Midnights. He brought an extremely positive attitude to both training and the matches, never seeming to lose focus in the field and with the bat. Through the season he steadily improved his batting, managing to add some defence to his repertoire of drives and pull shots, resulting in a top score of 10.
<b>Hugh McErlean</b>	Hugh was the second debutant the Midnights. His biggest concern when joining was to out-perform his grand-uncle who finished his career at Marist with an average of 1.7.
