Senior Cricketer of Year	James Haley	James has played at the highest levels of school and ACT representative cricket over his junior playing career, often as Captain. Winning the Colts competition was a fitting end to an outstanding cricketing career at Marist which extended for 9 years and included 2219 runs and 101 wickets and 44 dismissals. James contributed strongly throughout the premiership season with 433 runs and 10 wickets, with a match winning contribution in the semi-final, taking his 100th Marist wicket along the way. It was not only his individual efforts that made him stand out, but also the way he played with passion for his team and his mates. James contributed on the field, and prioritised Marist cricket over grade cricket finals, including during Carnival week. The First XI GF victory was a great way to end a stellar Marist career.
Junior Cricketer of the Year	Luca Ciocca-Marchant	Luca was central to Marist's victory in the U12 premiership of the Stage 2 Saturday Blue comp, and also represented the ACT in both the U12 and U13 Comets, and at the 12&U School Sports Australia (SSA) Championships. At Marist he was the leading run scorer in the competition with 381 runs at an average of 190.5, with three 50s and a top score of 68no. Luca also did the bulk of the wicket keeping duties for the team, where he took 7 catches and 1 stumping. In the T20 comp playing up in the Saturday Gold

Junior School Cricketer of the Year	Jack Smedley	In a Grand Final winning team with so many great contributors, Jack had an incredible season of cricket scoring 407 runs and taking 19 wickets at 7.63. An attacking and stylish left-handed batsman and left-arm swing bowler Jack was the highest run-scorer and batting award recipient in his team. His top score of 43 not out from 19 balls was against one of the best bowling attacks in the competition. Jack was also dominant with the ball taking 17 wickets from his left-arm deliveries shaping beautifully into the right-handed batsman or away from the left-hander. During the season, Jack willingly filled in for other Marist teams who were short on numbers. In his own games, Jack adjusted his skills to accommodate opponents who were first time players. Jack is a player who is always keen to practice, including with other Marist teams, and someone who likes to read widely on what makes a good cricketer.
Clubperson of the Year	George Denny	George epitomizes Marist school and club values through his dedication to his individual cricket, his team, his conduct and his service to the club. George has played for Marist every year since year 4 in either div 1 or ungraded levels. He has been a captain or co-captain for the last 3 seasons. As a captain – George places a premium on team harmony and identity while always setting an example of competing hard and in good spirit. Without a recognized keeper this year, George volunteered for this new role gloving some of the fastest bowlers in the school. As a batsman, George has shown determination and courage over many seasons, able to bat patiently or hit maximums if the game calls for it. Even in his last year of cricket at the school George sought to improve his cricket attending a cricket academy over the school holidays. On top of his playing, George has been coaching other Marist teams for the past 3 years, including giving additional one-on-one batting practice to junior Marist boys. Thanks for your service George.

With the ball, Henry Lejsek took an impressive 27 wickets at an average of 4.74.

TEAM PERFORMANCE: 6 Wins; 4 Losses; 1 Draw

The Marist Stage 1 Scorchers had a sensational season this year, blessed with some budding talent coming into year 4, along with some great seasoned players which created a very entertaining, well-rounded team. Inclement weather through November raised fears of a repeat of the 2021/2022 season, where many games were abandoned. Luckily, the weather was kind and the boys managed to complete their match schedule with only a couple of interruptions. The worst they had to contend with was overcoming the long grass at the start of the season, that played havoc with boundaries and gave them the curious job of sometimes having to search for a ball before it could be fielded.

All of the boys improved throughout the season, both in the field as well as with their batting and bowling. The team was fortunate in gaining some exceptional wicket keeping talent in the form of the Ferrari brothers Tom & Mason as well as Patrick, who barely required a backstop. When the team played on Marist's groomed fields it gave each of them a chance to demonstrate their stroke play, with plenty of boundaries and a high score of 201.

Each player combined well throughout the season, and all the boys had standout games throughout the year in different areas. They were sensational in the field with outstanding catches in the deep, as well as bullseye targeting of the stumps with runouts occasionally eclipsing bowling wickets on the score card. The boys batting really improved throughout the year as well as being deadly between wickets, taking singles whenever they could with strong calling.

There were some big scores with the bat this year from Noah, Tom, Ernest & Arthur which helped set many high targets or helped chase down big scores. With some great bowling by Ernest, Mason, Patrick, Arthur, Henry and Noah keeping the batsmen at bay.

Patrick Coffey	Patrick was very reliable with the ball, and when he found his line was able to pile pressure onto opposition batting line-ups, bringing down 9 wickets for the season. He also proved himself an excellent batsman and adroit batting partner, quickly getting on and off strike, pushing for singles with fluent stroke-play and generally being a great all-round performer.
Henry Curry	Henry performed well with the bat, with a balanced stroke that would consistently find the outfield. However, it was his on-field antics with the ball that would captivate his teammates (and exasperate parents and coaches alike) by leading the team in celebratory cries of "Siuuu!", occasional mimed synchronised swimming, and what were assumed to be short aerobics work-outs, following each and every wicket of the season.
Mason Ferrari	Mason often proved a challenge for the opposition with the ball (best figures of 2/5), with the bat (14 run high), with the keeping gloves, and in the field. Remarkably, Mason logged two maidens during the season (a relatively rare occurrence in Stage 1) which was an excellent demonstration of his potential.

Tom Ferrari	Tom came to the team with a natural timing and maturity with the bat that was fantastic to watch. Content to let the ball come to him, Tom was able to score comfortably with deftly placed glances and cuts that would see him quickly move from strike. His best score of 20 (the equal second highest for the team) was all the more significant due to his excellent defence, making him one to watch when he makes the leap to Stage 2.
Noah Johnston	Noah led the scoring for the Scorchers, earning a high of 23 in the final match of the season, contributing to his total of 115. His leg-spin and occasional seamers proved dangerous, earning 11 wickets and 3 maidens, and best figures of 2/0. In bringing his focus and excellence to both the games and training, Noah also distinguished himself with a natural and quiet leadership, setting an outstanding example for his peers and helping to lift the skills of the entire team.
Arthur McGrath	Arthur was a bundle of surprises for both opposition and teammates (and coaches) alike in his first season with the club. His natural curiosity and cheekiness courage shone through as he experimented with such things as the serpentine run-up and how to optimise his golf-swing to send full-length deliveries sailing over mid-on. To the chagrin of his coach, Arthur's innovative approach to the game proved consistently effective, scoring a game high of 16, best bowling figures of 2/3, and generally just being a great asset to have on the team.
Ernest Morrison	Ernie was all about bowling throughout the season, and was often heard campaigning for additional overs and trying to wrangle deals to trade time with the bat for more time with the ball (seemingly not interested in the fact that he was the second highest run-scorer overall). His focus and energy paid off, with his pace taking 12 wickets (best figures of 3/25) and getting close to a hat-trick.
Daniel Slater	Daniel had a bit of a breakthrough season, with dramatic improvements at the crease, bowling and in the field. Whilst his season statistics were hampered by a nagging injury, his attitude was irrepressible. Some of the most memorable moments included batting partnerships with Patrick (where they each scored their season highs), the last four matches of the season where Daniel was popping into the top 2-3 bowlers for each game, and his pace in the field, chasing down balls and firing back at the stumps, earning several run-outs with his 30-metre throws.
