President's Report

The last two seasons have really been seasons like no other. This time last year we were at home with no presentation possible as the world started the first of many lock downs. As such to even have a cricket season was a positive and a reason to celebrate. Despite the backdrop of a pandemic and the challenges of last season, Marist's position as the largest junior club in Canberra was confirmed as we had 289 boys and 27 teams registered to play our game. While I can't say categorically that this is the most boys, we have ever had play cricket at the college, our records indicate that there have never been more participants.

On the field Marist won 8 premierships including the coveted ASC title and we were runners up in 5 competitions with two of these runners up only being the result of washouts of Sunday Grand finals. The club won division 1 titles in u12's, u13's, u14's with the poor u11's losing the grand final after a remarkable undefeated season. Happily, I am told that most of the opposition team are seeking enrolment at Marist next year! Most importantly all of our boys played in great spirits and with the sportsmanship expected making it a wonderful season for Marist cricket.

Some of our individual milestones included:

- 3 centuries (Sanson x 2 & Di Campli)
- 10 five wicket hauls
- 5 hat tricks (Sam Ryan, Marcus Sykes, Callum Fenwick, Angus Rees, Lachlan Bourne)
- 3 ACT junior cricketers of the week (Sam Ryan, Matthew Smith, Elliot Rowson).

In addition to these individual achievements at the ACT Junior Presentation Night, Marist won the coveted Speakers Shield as the Champion Club and had Cameron Bushell receive a Spirit of Cricket award and Lucas Louis named Junior Male Cricketer of the Year.

Throughout the season we had more than 30 coaches and 27 managers giving large chunks of their time to allow the boys to get onto the field. I want to thank each one of these volunteers for their fantastic commitment to cricket at the school. I particularly want to acknowledge our student coaches who coached some of the stage one teams on a Friday – it is very much appreciated.

I want to single out two individuals who have made and continue to make incredible contributions to the Club. The first is Matt Scholtens whom is the recipient of the President's award this season. Matt is the person who manages our equipment, our registrations, and finances. He has never once asked for acknowledgement and was even in the equipment shed for 6 hours on his birthday this year! He has spent literally hundreds of hours of his own time behind the scenes making the rest of our jobs easy. Matt's contribution to the Club is enormous and without volunteers such as Matt, our sons don't get to play cricket for the college.

The second person I would like to acknowledge is Gary Goodman or Gov as he is affectionately known who is stepping down as First XI coach after 16 years of wonderful service to the College. Mr Goodman has been involved with cricket for 56 summers as a proud player for St George & Tasmania and countless other clubs and as the CEO of CACT and other prestigious roles. He is a Life Member of the Marist College Canberra Cricket Club and is the epitome of Cricket. Gary's passion for the game and his desire to improve cricketers at the College makes me proud to say that I know and have worked with him.

Finally, I would also like to acknowledge the Clubs major sponsors in Greg Chappell Cricket Centre in Fyshwick, Callida Consulting, the Southern Cross Club and Evolve Sports coaching.

TEAM PERFORMANCE: 11 wins, 0 losses, 2 draws



A note from Lynn Chua, team manager: Richard Austin has been coaching Marist cricket teams since 2017/18, though we only met in 2018/19 when I joined him (despite my lack of experience, skills, or any real meaningful awareness of the sport) as an assistant coach for one of the U10 sides. Taking my bearings amidst the vaguely controlled chaos of the first training session I (tactfully) asked Richard about his experience. My relief was palpable as he described a playing career with various clubs, the Royal Australian Navy and that he was currently playing in a local men's side. We spoke briefly about how we could each contribute, our time pressures and how we would run the team. When we discussed our goals for coaching Richard said something that stuck with me and put the whole thing in perspective:

"The point of juniors cricket is so the boys can have a good time with their mates, and we'll know we've done a good job if they all sign up to play again, next season"

As would so often be the case with Richard, his advice was succinct, straightforward and hard to argue with (not that any of those characteristics would ever stop his son, Jack, from trying).

With that single objective in mind, we proceeded to run a fun and entertaining season. I largely contributed moral support and encouragement, with Richard teaching them how to play the game. The team lost every match. Every boy had a great time. Every boy played cricket again for Marist the next season.

During that next season, the boys were more competitive: the balls stayed on the pitch, catches were held and runouts (and runs) happened. That they were winning games appeared to make no real difference to Richard: always calm and unfazed (even as Jack continued to experiment with off-spin). The only time I saw Richard disappointed in the team was when they failed to support each other.

As the team progressed to U12 (when they can go out) the method matured. Whilst all the other teams transitioned to give their more confident bowlers more and more time with the ball Richard remained resolute in giving all the boys an equal shot. We discussed it only once in the context of a boy on the other team who'd been dismissed for a duck towards the end of the innings and only got to bowl one over: "that kid's probably going to give up on the game before he gets a chance to see if he's any good. On the other hand, that team seems to have given up on him, so maybe it's for the best...".

Yet this season, that method really started paying off – all the kids could bowl, and they could all get some runs. As the season progressed the boys kept winning. At the end of the season the boys emerged undefeated (and incredibly cocky, but that's another story).

Richard's team were knocked out in the semi-finals. Once again, the method was in play. Every player got an equal shot at bowling and the batting order was mixed to give everyone an equal chance at scoring some runs in the finals game they had all earned a right to play in. The losing margin was only 30 runs. The extras alone were much higher.

Anyone could make the argument that if Richard had focused the line-up, it would have given the boys a better chance at winning, and they'd be correct. If we'd asked the boys, I'm sure they would agree. Probably the parents too. But that is missing the point. The harder decision: that the boys get an equal shot and that they all experience the pressure of a finals match, and that they

play that match the way they'd played that season was the right one. It's a demonstration of strength of character. Perhaps it contributed to losing but it was losing with integrity. There have been kids in opposing teams whose game encompasses only staying at the crease for less than one over and then only getting to bowl one over - that's not how cricket should work in this age group. How can a child improve their skills if never given the opportunity? Will that child return to cricket? Unlikely.

At Marist, we talk about working together to raise boys into fine young men. In this instance, I couldn't be happier and prouder for my son to get this demonstration of character and to have Richard as someone in his life. I'm grateful to the club for giving us all the opportunity, and I look forward to next season when the boys will no doubt do it all, again.
