### *President's Report*

Whichever way we look at it, the 2019-20 season has been an interesting one but a successful one for Marist Cricket. This season we had fire, heat, smoke, poor air quality, hail as well as the postponement of our presentation night due to an unprecedented pandemic. Despite this we had 250 boys registered to play cricket, a number that made us the largest junior club in Canberra despite not being able to field female teams. In total, the club fielded five under 10's team, six under 11's teams, three under 12's teams, five under 13's teams (including two division 1 teams), three under 14's teams, two under 15's teams and three senior teams. This high level of participation has meant that we have had 27 coaches and 27 Managers and hopefully around 196 scorers sharing the load across the season. Cricket is a big commitment for families and without parent support in driving your boys to games and helping the teams to run, our sons do not have any cricket to play. Thank you to all of you.

In thanking our volunteers, I also want to acknowledge the fantastic committee we have here at Marist. I won't name them all, but without them the club does not function. I have chosen not to award a President's award this year as I think there are too many people who contribute to this fantastic club without asking for any recognition. I would, however, like to publicly acknowledge Anne Kent, Matt Scholtens, Gary Goodman and Wayne Cassidy who do so much for the Club behind the scenes as well as Nick Myburgh who has been a valued member of the committee for many years. I also want to thank our newest committee member in Ellen Acheson who has navigated us through this "unique" summer with proactive and pragmatic response from a risk perspective in some really challenging times.

That said our Club is all about our players. Once again, the boys have achieved incredible success on the field with the club securing seven premierships and four runners up trophies. The Club also had an additional four teams in the semi-finals meaning that over 80% of our eligible teams played finals cricket. I know that we are the envy of many junior clubs with both our participation levels and the success we enjoy. Premiership winners were:

- Under 13 Division 2 Blue
- Under 14 Division 1 (Two Day)
- Under 14 Division 2 Blue (30 over & T20)
- Under 15 Division 1 (Two Day & T20)
- Under 15 Division 2 (30 overs)

The under 11 Division 1 (Grand Final washed out), the under 15 Division 2 (Grand Final washed out) and the First X1 (one day & T20 competition) were all runners up, while the under 12 Friday, the two under 13 Division 1 teams and the under 14 Division 2 Royal were all narrowly beaten in semi-finals. This is a remarkable effort across all age groups from a school club.

While cricket is truly a team game, we did have many strong individual performances in the season with 3 centuries, 49 half centuries, 14 five wicket hauls and 6 hat tricks being achieved by Marist players. Not forgetting the wicket keepers, we also had Noah Polishuk complete a remarkable six dismissals (only 8 wickets fell) in an under 13 match.

With the postponement of the presentation night, I would like to take the time to formally recognise our major award winners this season. There were a number of outstanding performances this season. The Senior Cricketer of the year was taken out by Jack Sanson who has once again scored a mountain of runs in the ASC competition. Jack is a terrific young player with a bright future in the game. In addition, our First XI captain Sam Myburgh ticked over 3,223 runs in just nine seasons at Marist to

overtake Tom Henry's high mark of 3,195 runs that was set in 2013-14. This record capped an outstanding nine years of cricket at Marist for Sam.

The Junior Cricketer of the year is James Haley who has led an under 14 team magnificently to a premiership taking 27 wickets at an extraordinary 7.6 runs per wicket and scoring 446 runs at 89.20. James also completed 12 catches making it a season to remember. In this category an honourable mention must go to James Martens who was brilliant for both the u15 Division 1 and the Colts side scoring 700+ runs for the year across both teams and Bede Cuddihy who was strong with both bat and ball for the under 13 Division 1 team as well as assisting some under 14 Division 2 teams.

This season the Club is for the first time awarding a Junior School Cricketer of the year with Jack Whalen from the under 11 Division 1 team our initial very deserving recipient. Jack had a fabulous year smashing 504 runs @ 38.77 and taking 26 wickets @ 6.3 including a hat trick as well as being an excellent wicketkeeper. There is definitely a number of players to keep our eye on in the future. Finally, I would also like to acknowledge the Clubs major sponsors in the Canberra Southern Cross Club, Greg Chappell Cricket Centre in Fyshwick and Evolve Sports coaching who support us financially and offer discounts to Marist families. If you are able, please continue to support these valued sponsors in extraordinary times.

To all our valued cricket community stay healthy and safe and bring on the next cricket season!

As Ashvin gets older and stronger, his increased pace will make him a real handful for cricketers in this age group. With the bat Ashvin moved up and down the order this season but will find a nice niche as a hard hitting middle order player as the boys get older and stronger.
- Sam Hosking** Sam is my favourite story of the season as he moved across to Marist from Grammar for the 2019-20 season. Sam started the season as a reluctant wicketkeeper and lower order batsman who could bat a "bit". - Jake Leonard:** Jake had a great season with the bat, the ball and in the field. Jake finished with the third highest batting average and was the second highest wicket taker, including one match against St Edmunds with the impressive figures of 5/1. Jake places good value on his wicket and his technique is solid making him one of the pillars of the batting line up. One memorable innings was his not out in the match winning final partnership in the tight win against Eastlake.
- Tyler Morrison:** Tyler was another one of the team’s quiet achievers. Tyler used training sessions to great effect to sharpen his spin bowling, proving to be a very difficult bowler to bat against in the nets. He carried this form into each match and was unlucky not to finish with more wickets over the season. Tyler was solid with the bat - combining well with his team mates for some crucial partnerships, and was reliable in the field.
- Noah Polishuk:** Noah demonstrated his skills across all elements of the game this season. Particular batting performances of note was his 42 against St Edmunds and 46 against Marist Blue, the latter as part of an 89 run partnership that moved the score on from 3/5 to 3/94. Spending half the game behind the stumps limited his bowling opportunities but when he did have the ball in his hand, he consistently bowled well-paced, dangerous spells. On his wicket keeping, it is safe to say there is no better keeper in the Division and his exploits were critical to a large number of the team’s wickets.
- Daniel Sajimon:** Daniel was the team’s “go to” bowler for the season. On the few occasions when Daniel wasn’t pencilled in to open the bowling, the team was very loud in their disapproval of the suggested bowling line-up and more often than not his name was moved back up to the top. Marist Under 13 Division 2 Royal had a very solid 2019-2020 season, arguably summed up in their first and final matches. In the first match of the season, Royal was one player short against an Eastlake Hawks side that featured three Division 1 players. Chasing 87 for victory, Royal lost four batsmen without scoring and was under a lot of pressure from some accurate Eastlake bowling. Kelley Jack steadied the ship with his highest score of the season (43), with Sam Smith (16\*) and Max Millgate (10) providing solid resistance in the lower order. In the end, Royal held their nerve and surpassed Eastlake's total by 15 runs.



Royal won every match they should have, losing twice to a Marist Blue side which featured greater depth and hitting power, and also losing to the top side, Grammar, by 20 runs. But despite losing against these higher-placed teams, Royal threw everything they had at both of them. In doing so, Royal showed great courage and a keen competitive spirit, whilst carrying themselves with a great sense of camaraderie and sportsmanship. This was on display in Royal's final match of the season; a cricketing slugfest against Marist Blue on 08 Mar 2020.

Having already lost to Marist Blue on two occasions by 35 and 43 runs, a lesser team would have folded in the semi-final. However, Royal, in their typically calm and no-nonsense manner, took the fight to their predominantly more senior opponent. Having lost a couple of early wickets, Royal scratched and clawed their way to a competitive total of 131. In the field, Royal threw everything they had at Blue, with Captain Matthew Wray showing great leadership by constantly encouraging his team-mates and regularly changing both field placements and bowling combinations. In the end, Blue managed to squeeze out a tie to rightfully earn their place in the grand final against Grammar.

Royal should be very proud of their performance throughout the 2019-2020 season. All of the boys behaved very well and their attitude towards every game, every opponent and every situation was excellent. Ben Cook and I were very fortunate to work with a great bunch of fine young men! Thank you to all of the parents for supporting your sons throughout another cricket season. Cricket can be a tough sport to enjoy as a non-cricketing spectator, but your presence and encouragement was appreciated.

### **THE PLAYERS**

**Hugh Cook:**

One of only three players to play every match of the season, Hugh was the leading wicket-taker with his pace bowling. Hugh also chipped in with some handy runs and showed great versatility in his ability to bat anywhere in the line-up. Hugh's Achilles' heel was his tendency to doubt himself. The lesson learned here is that no matter how talented a player is, their state of mind has a big impact on their performance. The message from your coaches is to always back yourself. Have faith in your ability and the effort you have put into improving your game with both bat and ball.

**Kelley Jack:**

Kel was a great addition to Royal, having stepped down from Division 1 to have more fun with his cricket and to play with his mates. Kel was a jack of all trades; Vice-Captain, top order batsmen, first choice wicket keeper, handy medium pace bowler and fine fieldsman. Kel's 43 in the opening match was instrumental in getting Royal's season off to a positive start. He is a great sport, great team-mate and a great all-round player who leads through his actions more so than his words. Kel provided a very safe set of hands in the field, proving to be one of Royal's best catchers.

- Evin Josephanil:** Evin was the ultimate team player, with a brilliant attitude and desire to do anything for his team-mates. Despite not scoring too many runs this season, Evin always hung around in the lower order and made his opponents work hard to earn his wicket. Evin's bowling improved from the 2018-2019 season in terms of accuracy and consistency, taking several key wickets in matches where Royal really needed them. Evin continues to work on his catching but is not alone in this area. It has been a pleasure to coach and work with Evin over the last two seasons.
- Mahran Mamun:** Mahran proved yet again to be one of Royal's best fielders, showing great courage to consistently throw his body behind the ball. A very quiet but tough young man, Mahran saved his greatest contributions for Royal's toughest opponent, Marist Blue. Coming into bat at 7/75 with plenty of overs left against a hungry Blue bowling line-up, Mahran produced a critical 10\* that was instrumental in Royal achieving a competitive total of 7/152 in round 7. Then, after a lay-off of over two months due to the mid-season break, Mahran bowled very well against Blue in round 14, taking 2/12.
- Max Millgate:** Max M was a dangerous leg-spinner and determined lower order batsman who worked hard to improve his game throughout the 2019-2020 season. Max's finest innings came in round 1 against Eastlake Hawks, where he fought hard for his team-mates to deliver a much-needed 10 runs to get Royal off to a winning start. When on song, Max's looping leggies were hard to play, and his ability to open the bowling at times took opponents by surprise. Examples included 1/11 against Queanbeyan in a hard-fought round 10 clash and 3/27 against Marist Blue in round 14.
- Tejas Nambissan:** The Vice-Captain from Royal's 2018-2019 premiership season, Tejas continued to show strong leadership this season, captaining the side early on and contributing as a senior player and one of Royal's best all-rounders. Tejas owned the fine leg fielding position (which he labelled 'back stop'), saving Royal many byes from this vantage point. Although his batting didn't get off to a great start, Tejas hit his straps during the back half of the season with six consecutive double-figure scores and four not-outs in his final six innings. Tejas was also one of Royal's most miserly bowlers with his accurate medium pacers.
- Elliot Parker:** One of the quietest players in the team, Elliot was a very handy all-round player, contributing with ball, bat and safe hands in the field. Elliot's batting could be dangerous. Although his batting style frustrated the coaches at times, it was instrumental in delivering Royal a much-needed win with an almost run-a-ball 25 in round 10 against Queanbeyan. In the bowling department, despite some wayward bowling Elliot proved to be the most economical of Royal's bowlers by season's end. At training, Elliot had one of the safest sets of hands when practicing outfield catching, and as a regular back-up keeper he proved to be quite versatile in his contributions to the side.
- Viira Peiris:** A very enthusiastic young player who primarily played in the Under 12 Division 1 side, Viira fitted in very well with Royal, attending almost every training session and making some fine contributions throughout the season. In round 8 against Eastlake Hawks, Viira scored a fantastic 49\* at greater than a run-a-ball. The fact that he was dismissed only once in the five innings he played for Royal was indicative of both the value Viira placed on his wicket, and the hundred balls a day he copped from his father Chris!

**Max Read:**

Max R proved to be one of Royal’s most prolific scorers throughout the season, often preferring to hit boundaries rather than run between wickets. One of his most crucial innings came against Queanbeyan in round 10 with a near run-a-ball 26\*, where the aerial route delivered the goods. From a coach’s perspective, Max’s most satisfying innings came in round 15 against a much-improved Eastlake Hawks outfit, where he showed dramatic improvement in his running between wickets on his way to 12\*. Max’s looping slow-medium in-swingers proved very useful as well, often deceiving the opposition batsmen and delivering Royal a much-needed wicket here and there. Max also delivered handy contributions with his back-up wicket-keeping.

**Sam Smith:**

Quiet as a church mouse, Sam proved a head-strong and smart cricketer and Royal’s best all-rounder. His first match against Eastlake Hawks resulted in a man-of-the-match performance with 16\* and 1/14 from 5 overs. Sam’s ability to score runs and take wickets when they really mattered was a key strength, as was his ability to bat anywhere in the batting line-up. His fast-medium out-swingers troubled numerous batsmen, and his ability to occupy the crease and then accelerate at key moments was superb. Sam was the only Marist Division 2 player to score over 150 runs and take at least 10 wickets, thereby proving to be one of the best all-rounders in the competition. One of his finest moments came in round 10 against Queanbeyan when, despite being as sick as a dog, Sam mustered all the strength he had that day to bowl one over in a tight match. He took 1/0, and that pretty much sums up Sam!

**Matthew Wray:**

Matt played to his greatest strength throughout the 2019-2020 season; his reliable batting technique. Born from the backyard of his former home in Oxenford, QLD and refined over three previous cricket seasons for Marist, Matt’s batting at times was an absolute joy to watch. His best innings was a gritty 44\* against Marist Blue, where at 7/75, Matt dug deep as part of a 77 run last-wicket partnership to steer Royal to a competitive 7/152. Unfortunately, Matt was dismissed for 4 in the semi-final against Marist Blue, but his superb captaincy, leadership and bowling effort (2/22) showed that he wasn’t a one-trick pony. Following his dismissal for a golden duck against Queanbeyan in round 3, Matt scored 171 unbeaten before his final dismissal of the season. His consistent batting, cool head, handy bowling and reliable fielding earned him the right to captain Royal for most of the season.

His ability to consistently hit great lines and lengths really troubled opposition batsmen, usually leading to rash shots or risky running between wickets resulting in regular wickets, setting up the team going into the later stages of the games. A change in coaching philosophy in the off-season for the Under 15 cricketers saw the boys train more as a squad in preparedness for the next step in their cricket development (to Colts/ 1<sup>st</sup> XI or grade cricket) which saw a number of players move in and out of both Div 1 & Div 2 teams. Whilst junior cricket rules did not allow for the plan to play out in an ideal fashion, along with clashes with training and game days means further tweaks to this system are required for next season.

### THE PLAYERS

- Rafay Abbas:** Loves to hit the ball and dominate bowlers. Made some good scores at the beginning of the season but struggled at times to take advantage of some good starts and go on and make big runs. Always looking to improve his game, enthusiastic in the field and a handy leg spinner who was underutilised in this role this season, once he works out how to 'go through the gears' as a batsman, he will be a force to be seriously reckoned with.

Jeremy also contributed in the field with good movement across the ground a strong arm and good hands along with handy lower order hitting at times when he a got a chance in the middle.
- Luke Golder:** Luke had an interesting season, being called upon in many roles as an opening/change bowler. His ability to stand the seam up and get extra bounce of a good length is an asset and the ability to bowl a 'heavy' ball made it difficult for a lot of the batsmen in the competition. As Luke became more comfortable in his role as in the team saw him take a large number of wickets at the end of the season including 6/44 vs. Norths in the Semi-Final. Batting in the nets like he does in a game will also accelerate this aspect of his game but his hard hitting against Queanbeyan before Christmas was memorable in the way he took the game away from the opposition.
